He also defined TLCBD’s role in the Response.</p> <p><u>-Update on TL Traffic Safety Task Force advocacy</u></p> <p>- Evan and Eric presented the TL Traffic Safety Task Force’s priorities for the year as shared with SFMTA leadership. These priorities are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. <i>Complete implementation of Jones Street Quick-Build and two new Quick-Builds - Hyde and Larkin - by end of 2022.</i>2. <i>Commit capital funds for pedestrian safety infrastructure like traffic signals, pedestrian scrambles, curb ramps, and audible pedestrian signals throughout the neighborhood.</i>3. <i>Work with the community to source Tenderloin Community Alternatives to Police for Traffic Enforcement (TLCAP) funding for outreach and pilot through 2022.</i>4. <i>Implement a parking/transportation study to determine availability of parking space, extent of its usage, and parking demand (i.e. residents, businesses, community workers, visitors, etc.). Also, provide estimation of parking fares and viability of workforce parking garage/program.</i>5. <i>Conduct robust community outreach before any Tenderloin transit services are modified</i>6. <i>Implement innovative community pilots like the Golden Gate Greenway, Speed Table Pilot, and Tenderloin Community-Based Transportation Plan.</i> <p>- The full priority letter can be viewed here</p> <p>- Resident involvement really occurs through the monthly Task Force meetings .</p>
