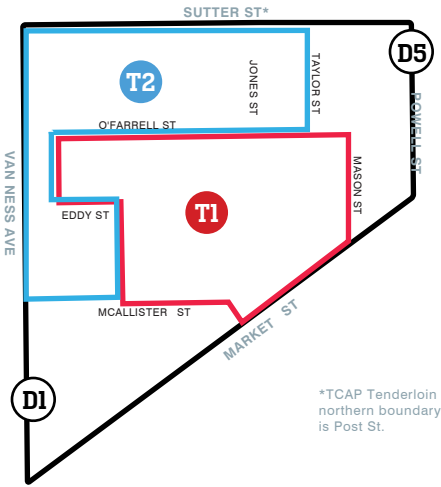
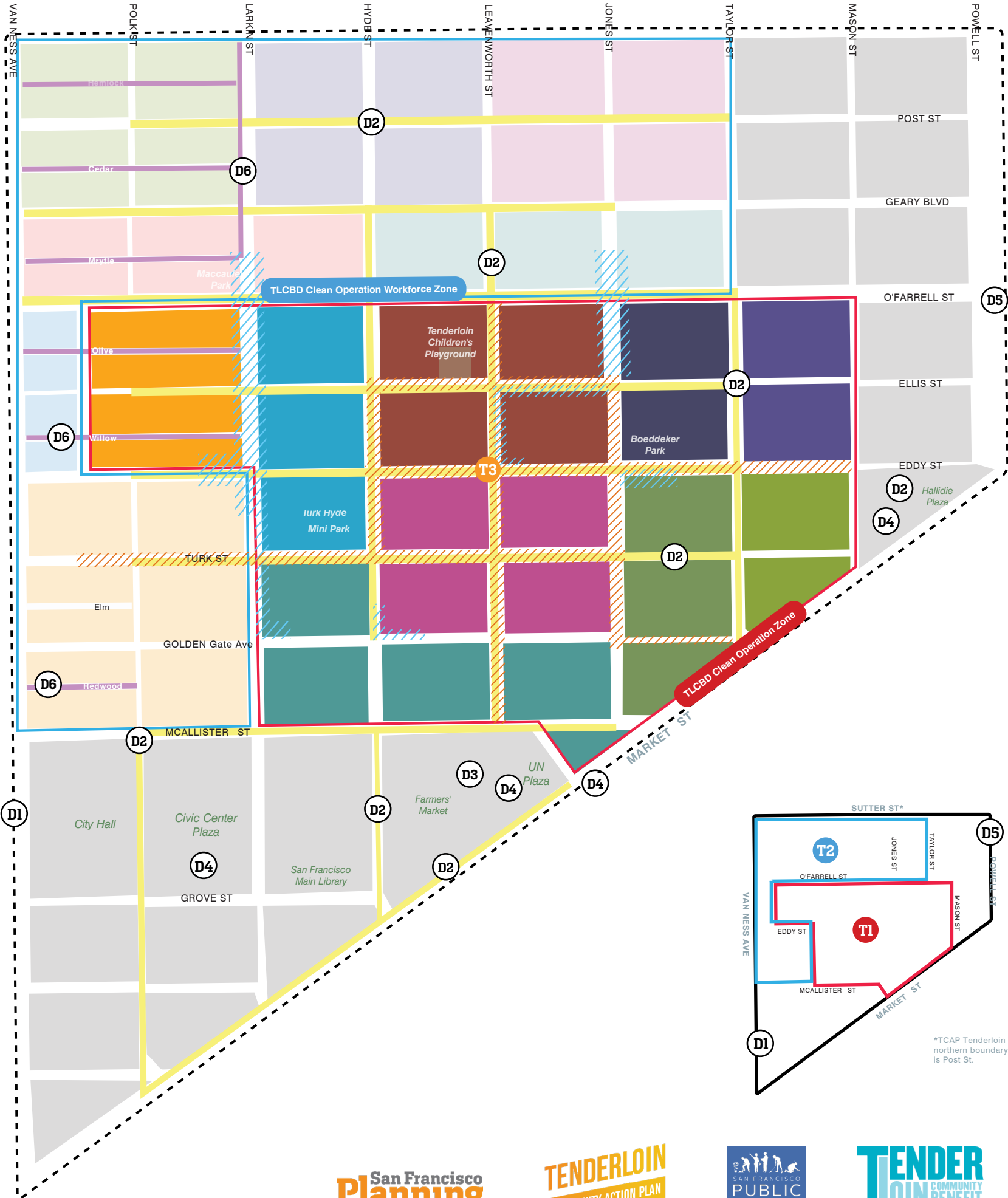

TENDERLOIN CLEANING MAP (VERSION: JANUARY 2025)

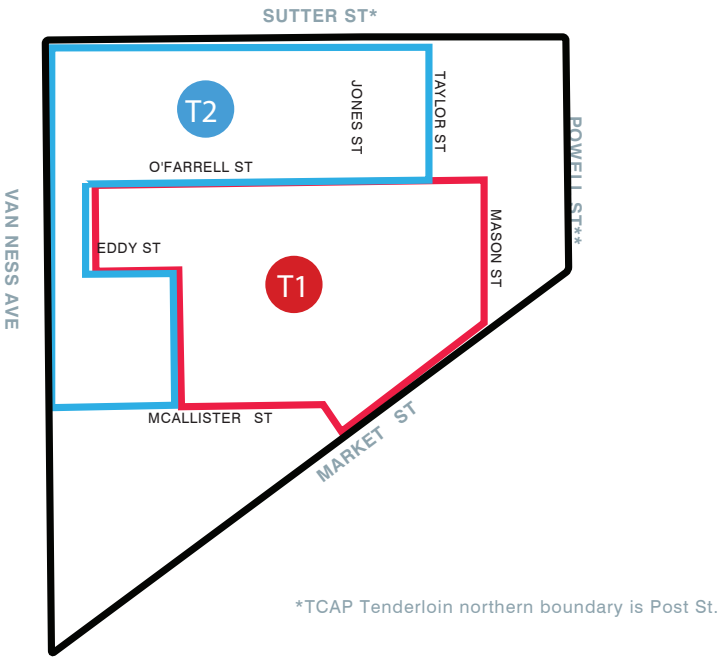
Overview

Cleaning in the Tenderloin relies on a significant contribution of resources, mainly by San Francisco Public Works (DPW) and Tenderloin Community Benefit District (TLCBD), along with other stewardship programs.

San Francisco Public Works’ Day Shift and Mechanical Street Sweeping Crew cover the whole neighborhood, while the Corridor Crew covers major corridors. These are supplemented by Swing Shift, Night Shift, and Alley Crew, which mainly focus on hotspots.

- TLCBD provides cleaning services in two areas:
- T1: The TLCBD Clean Operation Team Zone, covering the Tenderloin’s core blocks.
 - T2: The TLCBD Clean Operation Workforce Team Zone.

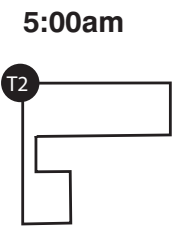


CONTACT SF311 TO REQUEST CLEANING SERVICES

- TLCBD handles 311 requests with the T1 zone.
- Public Works handles 311 requests throughout the TL, including requests from T2 zone and the requests in T1 zone that aren’t addressed by TLCBD within 24 hours.

Timeline of Cleaning in the TL

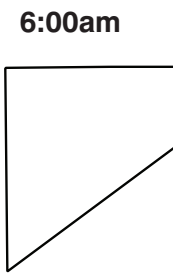
Neighborhood-wide Cleaning



The day begins with the **TLCBD Clean Operation Workforce Team** cleaning areas outside the Tenderloin's core blocks.

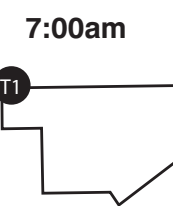
TLCBD Clean Operation Workforce Team’s cleaning includes manually sweeping sidewalks and gutters, litter removal, topping off/removal of debirs from overflowing City trash receptacles and calling in 311s for Public Works to handle. *Note: **No Pressure Washing**.*

Once the team finishes cleaning its zone, it joins the **TLCBD Clean Operation Team** to assist in the cleaning of core Tenderloin blocks.



Public Works Day Shift begins. The crew includes ***litter patrols*** who respond to 311 service requests and pick up trash as they make their rounds; ***steamers*** who power wash the sidewalks with a focus on addressing biowaste; and ***mechanical sidewalk sweeping*** throughout the Tenderloin.

Throughout the day, the litter patrol crew drives out to dump collected trash at Recology Transfer Station on Tunnel Road, then return to the Tenderloin to continue cleaning or respond to 311 service requests that aren’t responded by TLCBD.



In the Tenderloin core blocks, **TLCBD Clean Operation Team** starts power washing, manual sweeping, removing hazardous materials / needles, feces cleanup, graffiti abatement. The team also responses 311 service requests .

Hotspots and Corridors Cleaning

Additional cleaning is provided throughout the neighborhood hotspots that are pre-identified and hotspots identified through daily operations. Designated safe passage zones and business corridors also receive additional cleaning.



A 23-member **Public Works Block Sweeper Corridor Crew** manually sweeps the sidewalk and curb lanes daily. The focus on certain routes and some fixed hotspots including Hallidie Plaza and UN Plaza.

10:00am Safe passage zones and business corridors receive additional cleaning by the **TLCBD Clean Operation Swing Shift** on Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays until 6pm to provide clear routes for children as they leave school and for businesses as they open. They have two manual sweepers and one power washing truck.

1:30pm **TLCBD Clean Operation Workforce Team** completes its shift.

Public Works Swing Shift begins. Similar to the Public Works Day Shift crew, the swing shift crew includes litter patrols, steamers and mechanical sweeper that runs an unscheduled route to respond as needed. In addition, the crew also has a flat-rack truck that picks up larger discarded items, and a packer truck that hauls items picked up in the Tenderloin to the dump.

2:30pm **TLCBD Clean Operation Team** team completes its shift.

3:00pm **Public Works Day Shift** completes.

4:30pm **Public Works Corridor Crew** completes its shift.

6:00pm **TLCBD Clean Operation Swing Shift** completes.

10:30pm **Public Works Swing Shift** completes.

Night-time Cleaning

10:00pm - 6:00am **Public Works Night Shift** cleans all plazas again as well as the Market Street corridor, following a fixed routes with steamers & flushers.

Public Works Alley Crew conducts a monthly overnight deep cleaning of the alleys between Larkin Street and Van Ness Avenue.

2:00am - 8:00am **Public Works Mechanical Street Sweeping Crew** conducts daily clean in the Tenderloin to remove litter and debris. Streets are cleaned three to seven times a week, depending on location.
